RALEIGH COUNTY BEEKEEPERS COOPERATIVE ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING

Thursday, January 19, 2017

ROLL CALL – The Raleigh County Beekeepers Cooperative Association met in regular session on Thursday, January 19, 2017 at 6:30PM at Munson Hall with the following members present: President, Mark K. Lilly, Secretary, Debra Baer, Treasurer, R. Darrin Butcher. Vice President, Robert K. Jarrell was absent.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA /ADJUSTMENTS

R. Darrin Butcher called the meeting to order and requested approval of the agenda. Mr. Butcher made the motion to approve the agenda, Mark Lilly, seconded, motion passed unanimously.

RECOGNITIONS

COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS

- Meeting opened with Mr. Lilly requesting everyone introduce themselves and provide the group with the number
 of hives they currently operate, Of 18 members that provided a count, a total of 148 apiaries were counted. Mr.
 Lilly stated that there is good mix of new and old beekeepers considering the group has only been operating
 since August. The primary goal of the organization is education to provide consistency in the art of beekeeping
 and updates on new treatments. Group will not be involved in mis-information or old wives' tales. The group
 will operate to provide members information based on best practices and methods.
- Board Reports R. Darrin Butcher, Treasurer, stated that he and Mark Lilly had completed meetings with students at the schools and had gotten a final count of students and instructors that would be taking the Beginning Beekeeping Course. A total of 13 students and 3 instructors were signed up from Liberty High School and Shady Spring High School.
- Other Reports
 - Rebecca Moretto, WV Department of Agriculture State Apiary Inspector provided a
 presentation on hive inspections, health of colonies, registering bees, disease, sanitation of
 tools and inspection checklists.
 - Mr. Butcher provided an update on the Beginning Beekeeping course starting on February 13, 2017. He stated that the course was filling up fast and considering there would be 16 students and instructors from ACT, there was a very good possibility that a second Saturday course would be warranted. The high school students would receive the course for free. Raleigh County Schools agreed to create the apiary yard which will benefit both high school students as well as members of the RCBCA. Mr. Butcher and Mr. Lilly further stated that another benefit of taking the course other than the opportunity for hands-on experience in the apiary yard, that those taking the course may also get a visit to their own apiary yard to inspect and possibly treat. Mr. Lilly also stated that he would provide students with local vendors selling nucs in the spring. Further, it was stated that the RCBCA will consider offering an intermediate course in the future. Mr. Lilly stated again that the main purpose of the group is education and that we don't want folks to take the class and walk away. We want students to become members and participate in the RCBCA.
 - Mr. Butcher requested a meeting of volunteers for Saturday, February 11th to design the Apiary Yard for Raleigh County Schools, determine a materials listing and provide an estimated cost to the Board of Education for the Peters Farm location. Mr. Butcher stated that the meeting would be at 10:00AM at the BOE Central Office.

 A brief discussion was had regarding brush-cutting at the Peters Farm location. Mr. Butcher stated that he would contact the volunteers that signed up when the weather is acceptable.

Mr. Lilly stated that this was the 100th anniversary of the WV Beekeepers Association and that the conference would feature some excellent speakers. There will also be programs for spouses and children that may not be interested in attending the conference.
